Tuesdays | 3:45 - 4:45 p.m. | 1st - 5th grade | Sept. 19 - Oct. 24 | \$300 per student

In this group-lesson tennis class, students will be taught balance, hand-eye coordination exercises, and basic swing exercises. Our goal is to help each child realize their personal excellence on the court through simple and easy-to-understand instructions. Our teaching method focuses on targeting one key area at a time while keeping a long-term vision of higher excellence for the student. The Pawsitive Pack

The Pawsitive Pack is a Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) program that approaches both teaching and reinforcing SEL skills through interactions with dogs. The program is adapted from the Mutt-i-grees Curriculum, which was developed by Yale University School of the 21st Century in partnership with North Shore Animal League. The goal is for students to develop skills that make them capable of empathy, compassion, and responsible decision-making, while also teaching them what it means to be part of high-quality relationships.

Students will collaborate in small teams to select a charity or issue they feel passionate about and come up with practical ways they can support that cause (including raising awareness, volunteering, and fundraising), then create their own mock foundation!

Moon Metalsmithing

Wednesdays | 3:45 - 5:00 p.m. | 3rd - 5th Grade | Sept 20. - Nov. 8 | \$375 per student

Students will work with T. Martin to learn and explore a variety of metals techniques. Starting with Turkish-style copper engraving as a basis for pattern creation, students will learn how to work with sheet, wire, a jeweler's saw, torch, stone-setting tools, files, polishing, casting and enameling equipment, along with many other tools to learn all about the world of artistic

metalwork. Students are presented with opportunities to try new techniques to expand their repertoire, and then incorporate their favorite styles of work as they move into longer-term projects of their choosing.

Students have the opportunity to follow their passions- in previous semesters students have made ornate plates, functional bowls, rings with gemstones, all manner of earrings, trees, game boards, utensils, tools, figurines, necklaces, keychains, forged sculpture, wire-wrapped stonework, and so much more.
